Illuminate Investigate Innovate Cultivate Celebrate Graduate Attendance Policy

Emereau Bladen Charter School's attendance policy is designed to ensure that students attend school regularly, which is crucial for their academic success and overall development.

1. Attendance Requirements:

- Students are expected to attend school daily.
- Attendance is taken during each class period or school day.
- Punctuality is important; students must be on time for school and each class.
- K-8 students at Emereau are required to be in attendance at least 94% of the school year to comply with NC Attendance Law.

2. Excused Absences:

- Absences may be excused for reasons such as illness, medical appointments, family emergencies, religious observances, and other situations approved by the school administration.
- Documentation (e.g., doctor's note, parent note) may be required to verify excused absences.

3. Unexcused Absences:

- Absences without a valid reason or proper documentation are considered unexcused.
- Excessive unexcused absences may lead to actions such as parent conferences, impact on academic performance, possible retention, and/or a *prima facie* case.

4. Tardiness:

- Students are expected to arrive on time. Repeated tardiness may result in actions such as parent conferences and impact on academic performance.
- Tardiness is arriving after 7:50 AM.

5. Make-up Work:

- Students are responsible for making up any missed work due to absences in a timely fashion.
- After a single absence, students should complete missed assignments within three school days and return them to their teacher(s).
- Students who are absent, or anticipate being absent for two or more days, should arrange to obtain assignments from their teacher.
- o In the event that a student misses multiple consecutive days, they should have 7 days after their last day of absence to return all missed assignments to their teachers.
- The student, parent, and teacher should work together to address concerns in response to individual student absences to support the student and promote their academic success.



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 If the student is absent for an educational opportunity, parents or guardians of the student should issue a written request to an administrator at least one week before the absence for approval and requirements.

6. Truancy:

 Truancy, defined as excessive unexcused absences, is taken seriously and may involve interventions such as counseling, parent meetings, and referral to truancy officers or juvenile court.

7. Notification:

- Parents are often required to notify the school of a student's absence as soon as possible.
- Schools may use automated systems to inform parents of their child's absence.
- Families may receive written notification of excessive absences at (3, 6, and 10 days)

8. Parental Responsibilities:

 Parents are encouraged to ensure their children attend school regularly and to communicate with the school regarding any absences or attendance issues.

9. School Interventions:

 Schools may implement interventions to support regular attendance, such as attendance improvement plans, mentorship programs, and providing resources for families in need.

10. Legal Considerations:

Attendance policies are aligned with state laws and regulations regarding compulsory education.
